The Judge's Corner



"The Judge's Corner" has appeared in this paper with a varying degree of regularity since 1991. CGA Judges, Members and Work Crew are invited to submit difficult calls or unusual questions that occur so that others can learn from their experiences. The best ones (unusual or just plain odd) will be printed here.

If you have input for this column, please send your question to the CGA State Office. Your question will be answered by a Master Judge and the Rules Chairman. If there is any disagreement, it will be submitted to the Rules Committee and MAC for final resolution.

3.1 a CLOTHING: All contestants shall be fully attired in a dress shirt with a button or snap closure in the front from top to bottom, collar, long or short sleeves (female contestants may wear sleeveless shirts), long pants, belt or half belts and boots. The sleeves on long sleeved shirts must be rolled down and fastened at the cuff. Shirts must be tucked into the pants. Only the top two buttons of the shirt may be left unbuttoned as long as the buttons go to the collar lines of the shirt.

This year at the State Show 2017, the MAC reviewed a shirt that was long sleeved and had a ruffle at the cuff. No snaps or buttons. After much discussion it was voted that this type of dress shirt was not legal. MAC reviewed the 3/4 length sleeve, voted it to be a legal shirt. MAC also reviewed the rolled up sleeves that have tabs. After much discussion they were voted not legal.

Please if you have any questions or concerns please contact your Master Judge for your district, who if needed will contact the Rules Chairman. If there is any further discussion or decisions that need to be made it will be submitted to the MAC for final resolution.

Family Team Award

CGA is a Family organization and in recognition of the many families that ride together in CGA we offer a Family Team Award available to all riders regardless of ability.

The Family Team Award is 60 days retroactive from the date of the postmarked application or the show date if applicable. The \$125.00 fee per rider includes the Year End Award Level 1, Silver Buckle, Silver Breast Collar Set. For an additional \$20 the applicant can include both Level 1 & 2 Year End Awards.

The Family Team Award is a Special Jacket for each team member embroidered with the riders first name and rating division on the front. The back of the jacket will have a barrel racer figure (male or female) and the last name of the "family" above the words "Family Team Member". All jackets within a "family" must use the same last name. Teams may consist of parents, children, grandchildren, cousins, aunts, uncles, or any other *relatives* so long as the last name is the same.

All riders on a "team" must earn at least a FC rating in order to qualify for the jacket. That means that all the riders on the team must complete at least 3 good rides in at least 4 events to qualify for the Family Team award.

Each team member's jacket will reflect their own rating level and each member will receive their own rating level for the year end award that is included in the \$125.00 fee.

This is a great way for the entire family to participate and work towards an award that they can wear with pride.

Sign up today so that your family doesn't lose any rides. This is a fun award to earn and a great way to enjoy gymkhana with your family.

State Show 2017

Well we've all had a chance to unpack, clean out our trailers, give our ponies a day or two off (well most of us anyway. There are those few die-hards that were right back at it the same day they were home! You know who you are). Hopefully we've all done a few dozen loads of laundry and had some down time to reflect on our past season. And what a season it was! 2016-2017 show season proved to be a challenge for quite a few districts, with the wintery weather, excess rain and flooding in a lot of areas and cancellation of quite a few shows. This was a unique year, to say the least. Most of us managed to survive the winter with minor scrapes and bruises and saddled up for show season, starting as late as May for some districts. Yes, you heard that right! Some districts couldn't start their show season until May, due to the rain and floods, repairs and re-structuring.

And the grand finale of our show season for 2016-2017 was CGA State Championship Finals, held at Bolado Park Fairgrounds, just outside of Hollister, CA. July 21-29, 2017, over 200 riders, along with their family members gathered to compete in the Grand Daddy of them ALL! Although 'State Show' was a bit smaller this year than the prior year, by approx. 40 riders, we managed to host what most are calling the 'Best State Show in Recent Memory'! I do have to agree.

From our flawless camp check in where almost nobody was asked more than once to display their camping tags, dog check in-flawless as well and nobody this year had to be told to turn off their air conditioner (for fear of blowing a power circuit due to the demand that the air conditioners take on the grids). Congratulations to you all for following the rules so effortlessly, making everyone's job run so smoothly. There were many comments made about how well everyone adhered to the park rules.

State Show ground. This has been a topic of much discussion in the past and let me tell you, I've never heard so many people compliment the ground, the ground crew and each day noticed how the arenas continued to improve. HUGE, HUGE accomplishment for a show of this magnitude to be able to boast that not one single rider went down due to a slip and fall, caused by the footing. NOT ONE! That's over 200 riders, riding 13 events, match races, team events and set ups, over the course of a week. That is well over 2600 runs and not a SINGLE downed rider, due to the ground conditions. This is a massive feat!

How about those awards given out at the high point awards ceremony!?! Cactus tack is excellent quality, long lasting, premium brand of awards and high point winners, along with many placings down the line, walked away with LOADS of Cactus tack. I'm pretty sure that some of you had to go back and get a wheelbarrow to carry all of your awards to camp. Again, I heard so many compliments on the awards given out. It's always refreshing to hear people giving out compliments and showing positivity and gratitude.

As well as the awards, I'd like to take a moment to emphasize that this show alone, gave away more than 250 buckles, totaling more than \$13,000, for each first place per division. You did not read that wrong, \$13,000 in BUCKLES ALONE! There is no other show around that gives buckles for each first place, in each division, over 13 events, plus buckles to match race winners, team event winners, over-all match race winner, over-all skill and over-all speed. This is an unheard-of amount of buckles. There are many things that set State Show apart from the others, however this is definitely in the top 5 reasons why State Show ROCKS!

There are so many thank you's to be given out, to so many persons, wearing SO MANY different hats, that it would be impossible to list each person and what they did specifically. A show of this size and caliber takes months to organize, set-up, produce and tear down that some persons spend more than 2 weeks total at Bolado Park. Showing up days before any other campers arrived and leaving days after everyone had already gone home. This is the kind of work that goes on behind the scenes. Most times nobody sees the day to day tasks, the behind-the-scenes paperwork process, crew organizing, meetings, moving of equipment from 'here' to 'there' 40,000 times over a week, walking what feels like 37 miles a day, from arena 1, to 2, to 3, to 4, to 5 then back again, and repeat for infinity! In order to host as many riders as we do on average, with power hook ups, camping space, comfortable horse stalls or pens, engineering the electrical to be able to accommodate 5 arenas, hosting match races EACH NIGHT as well as giving time for everyone to have a break during the day, rest, make dinner and do it all again the next day, a MASSIVE venue is required. For the time being, Bolado Park is continuing to provide all the necessary criteria for us to be able to hold State Show, in the manner we've all grown to know and love. So for now, this is where we'll call State Show HOME. We hope that you plan on attending next year and for many years to come. And as usual, be sure to tell a friend, bring a friend or encourage a new rider at your district to try it out for themselves. I bet one match race experience, either in the stands, in the pits or in the arena, and they'll be a State Show-er for LIFE! To all of our fellow 'Lifers', we say- See you ALL next year! Let's make 2018 even better!

Senior Elite Awards Program

The Senior Elite (SE) awards program is a modified version of the ROC program designed to provide competition and awards for the fastest and most accurate senior riders within the CGA (those 45 and older as of Jan 1st of the current show season). To be eligible for this program, the rider must provide proof of age, and the horse/rider combination cannot be signed up for the ROC program in the same show season. This program is for horses only (no pony divisions).

The ultimate achievement for an SE rider is to ride to the Senior Elite. Any SE rider who during the show season becomes AAA+ rated in ten (10) of the thirteen (13) events using the SE Matrix will be entered into the CGA Senior Elite. They will receive a special Senior Elite buckle at the CGA Annual convention. In the event the rider does not earn a Senior Elite buckle, the rider will be eligible for the Level 1 Award using the normal Rating Matrix. If the rider does not also receive an Senior Elite Champion or Reserve Champion jacket, they have the option of receiving a Senior Elite jacket instead of the buckle.

Senior Elite Champion In Each Event

The riders with the 1st and 2nd best average times in the event are the SE Champion and SE Reserve Champion, respectively. SE Champions and Reserve Champions will receive an SE jacket listing each event in which they are Champion or Reserve Champion.

Senior Elite Top Ten Riders

The CGA's Senior Elite Top Ten Riders will be determined by the following method: the rider's fastest 3 rides in each event are averaged. The 10 riders in each event with the fastest average will be given points as follows:

1st - 11 points	2nd - 9 points	3rd - 8 points	4th - 7 points
5th - 6 points	6th - 5 points	7th - 4 points	8th - 3 points
9th - 2 points	10th - 1 point		

Points from all thirteen (13) events will be added together, and the Ten riders with the most points will become a member of CGA's Senior Elite Top Ten. Any ties will be broken by determining which rider has won the most first places. If the tie still exists, the rider with the most second places is selected. This process is continued, if necessary, to the place required to break the tie. Senior Elite Top Ten Riders must have a SE rating of at least AAA using the normal Rating Matrix. They will receive a special Senior Elite Top Ten buckle or jacket.

Registration and Fees

The SE registration fee is \$125.00, which includes the Level 1 award. A Senior Elite rider that achieves Senior Elite will receive the Senior Elite award, but not the Level 1 award. A Senior Elite Rider that does not achieve Senior Elite will receive the Level 1 award.

Senior Elite riders may sign up for Level 1 and Level 2 awards for a fee of \$145.00. A Senior Elite rider that achieves Senior Elite will receive the Senior Elite awards and the Level 2 award. A Senior Elite rider that does not achieve Senior Elite will receive both the Level 1 award and the Level 2 award. Fees are not refundable.

Explanation of 5-D Jackpots

For All CGA State Sponsored Shows

Note: District's may alter all the Jackpot options as they choose for local shows running jackpots or Mystery jackpots

Riders may optionally enter a jackpot for any or all of the regular events. The cost is an additional \$5.00 per event, and a rider may choose to enter the Jackpot for none, some, or all of the regular events. These jackpots are unrelated to the rider's division or age, and whether or not they are riding a horse or a pony. They are based strictly on the time the rider achieves in that event. *Only the times of the Riders entering the Jackpots count.* The size of the payout is determined by the number of riders in the jackpot. The Payout is:

Fastest ride	- 40 % of the jackpot
2-D ride	- 30 % of the jackpot
3-D ride	- 10 % of the jackpot
4-D ride	- 10 % of the jackpot
5-D ride	- 10 % of the jackpot
CGA - None.	All jackpot money is paid back to the riders.

2-D, 3-D, 4-D and 5-D rides are those that come the closest (*without going faster*) to the fastest time of those entering the jackpot +(plus) the adjustment factor for that event. The adjustment factors are listed below.

For example, if the fastest ride in Poles I was 10.990 seconds, and the jackpot was \$400.00, then that rider would receive \$160.00. The rider closest to the 2-D time of 12.524 (10.990 + 1.534) *without going faster* would receive \$120.00. The rider closest to the 3-D time of 14.057 (10.990 + 3.067) *without going faster* would receive \$40.00. The rider closest to the 4-D time of 15.591 (10.990 + 4.601) *without going faster* would receive \$40.00. The rider closest to the 5-D time of 17.125 (10.990 + 6.135) *without going faster* would receive \$40.00.
